

**REPORT ON PARENTS' FEEDBACK REGARDING
DESIGN AND REVIEW OF CURRICULUM**

(2019-20)



Result of Analysis of Parents' Feedback Regarding Design and Review of Curriculum (2019-20)

Parents have to bear the stress which their wards undergo in case there is any fallacy in the curriculum design, therefore feedback from parents on review and design of curriculum becomes essential on certain parameters. With this objective following survey was carried out to know the perception of parents regarding design and review of curriculum.

Feedback from parents allows them the opportunity to comment on various aspects of curriculum. This provides us with valuable suggestions for further improvement of the curriculum, which can be forwarded to the university through various faculty members who are members of Board of Studies.

Methodology

The feedback from parents on designing and review of curriculum was obtained through Structured Questionnaire which included 10 questions on various aspects of curriculum.

A five point Likert scale has been used with weights assigned from 1 to 5 to different levels as follows:

- 1- Strongly Disagree
- 2- Disagree
- 3- Neutral
- 4- Agree
- 5- Strongly Agree

The Range of each order or level is determined by the following formula:

(Highest point in Likert Scale- Lowest point in Likert Scale)/ Number of Levels Used

Therefore Range= $(5-1)/5=4/5=0.8$

Hence

Range for 'Strongly Disagree' is 1.0 to 1.8

Range for 'Disagree' is 1.8 to 2.6

Range for 'Neutral' is 2.6 to 3.4

Range for 'Agree' is 3.4 to 4.2

Range for 'Strongly Agree' is 4.2 to 5.0

Sampling method was used to determining the questionnaire in this analysis. 1060 parents' feedback forms were obtained for analysis. While calculating Weighted Mean Score we have ignored number of No Responses.

Data Analysis and Interpretation

Following is the tabular analysis of each question showing number of parents' responses on five point Likert scale, percentage of parents' responses, weighted score and weighted mean score of each question.

Question No: (1) Your ward is comfortable in coping up the workload of the college.

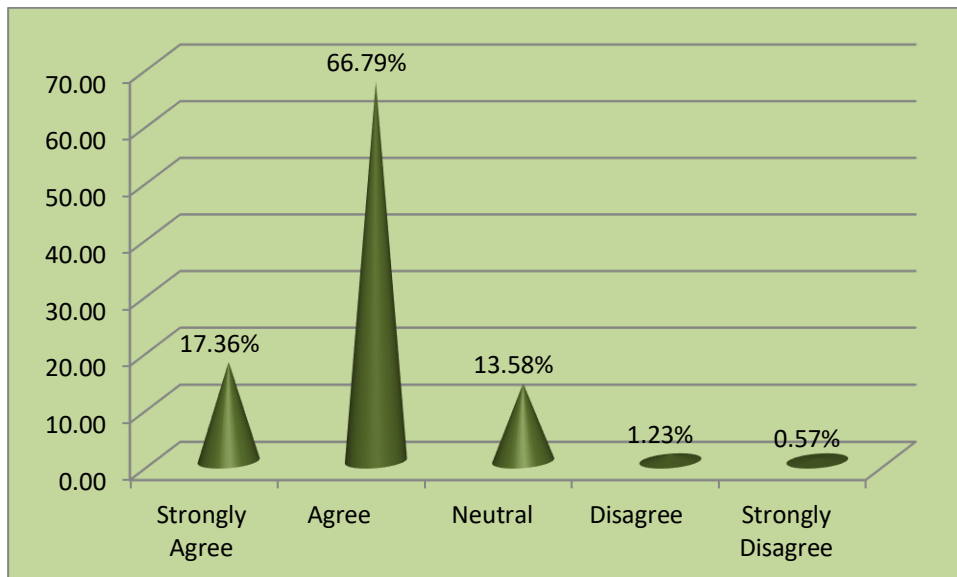


Figure 1 - Percentage of responses on coping up with the workload of the college.

Table 1 shows that out of 1060 parents surveyed, 184 parents i.e. 17.36 % of the parents strongly agree that their ward is comfortable in coping up the workload of the college, 708 i.e. 66.79 % of the parents agree for the same, 144 i.e. 13.58 % of the parents views are neutral, 6 i.e. 0.57 % of the parents disagree and 0.47 % of the parents strongly disagree that their ward is comfortable in coping up the workload of the college. The results to Question 1 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 1.

Here it is also observed that Weighted Mean Score of Question No. 1 is 4.00 which lies between the Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 i.e. range for 'Agree'. So, it can be concluded that there is agreement among parents that their ward is comfortable in coping up the workload of the college.

Question No: (2) The availability of reference material and books related to the curriculum being taught is sufficient in college library.

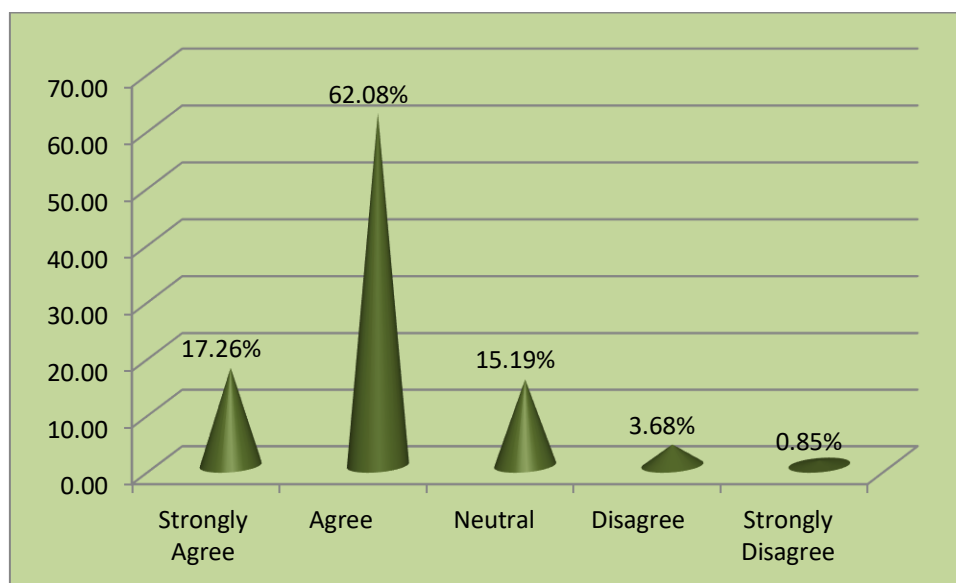


Figure 2 - Percentages of responses on availability of reference material and books related to the curriculum in college library.

Table 2 shows that out of 1060 parents surveyed, 183 i.e. 17.26 % of the parents strongly agree that there is availability of reference material and books related to the curriculum in college library, 658 i.e. 62.08 % of the parents agree for the same, 161 i.e. 15.19% of the parents views are neutral, 39 i.e. 3.68/ % of the parents disagree and 0.85% of the parents strongly disagree that there is availability of reference material and books related to the curriculum in college library. The results to Question 2 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 2.

Weighted Mean Score of Question No. 2 is 3.92 which fall in the Likert range of ‘Agree’ and hence it can be concluded that the parents agree that there is availability of reference material and books related to the curriculum in college library.

Question No: (3) There is adequate availability of syllabus based e-resources.

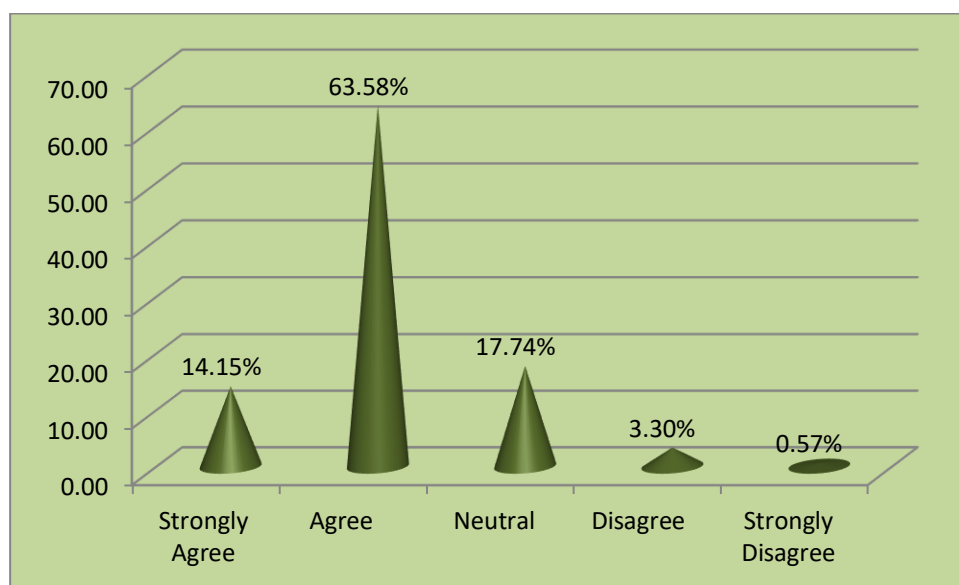


Figure 3 - Percentage of responses on adequate availability of syllabus based e-resources.

Table 3 reveals that out of 1060 parents surveyed it was found that 150 i.e. 14.15 % of the parents strongly agree that there is adequate availability of syllabus based e-resources, 674 i.e. 63.58 % of the parents agree for the same, 188 i.e. 17.74 % of the parents views are neutral, 35 i.e. 3.30 % of the parents disagree and 0.57% of the parents strongly disagree that there is adequate availability of syllabus based e-resources. The results to Question 3 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 3.

Question No.3 has Weighted Mean Score of 3.88, so it can be concluded that parents agree that there is adequate availability of syllabus based e-resources.

Question No: (4) The curriculum being taught is relevant to the modern times and employability.

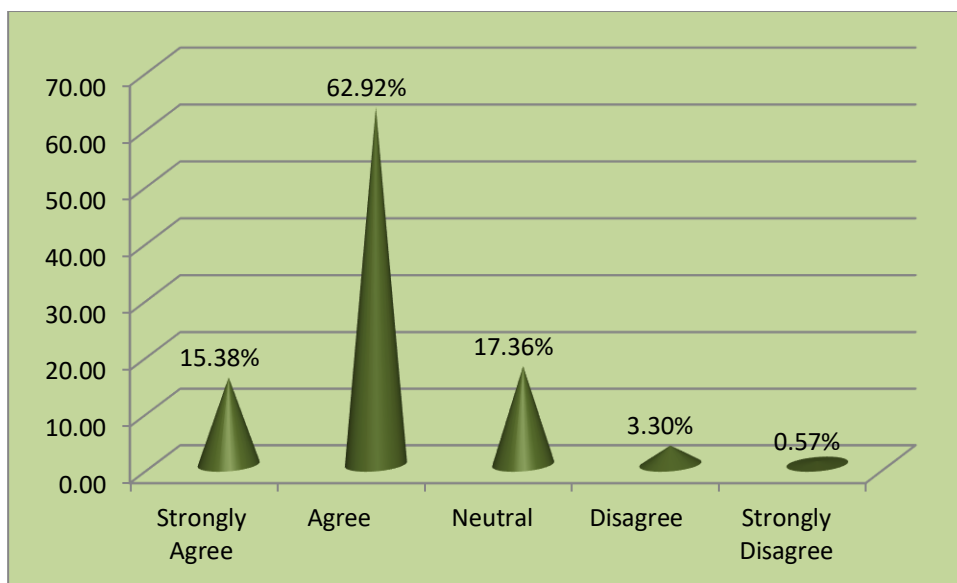


Figure 4 - Percentage of responses on relevance of curriculum taught to the modern times and employability.

From the above table 4 it is clear that out of 1060 parents surveyed, 163 i.e. 15.38 % of the parents strongly agree that the curriculum being taught is relevant to the modern times and employability, 667 i.e. 62.92 % of the parents agree for the same, 184 i.e. 17.36 % of the parents views are neutral and 0.57% of the parents disagree and 0.47% of the parents strongly disagree that the curriculum being taught is relevant to the modern times and employability. The results to Question 4 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 4.

Here it is observed that Weighted Mean Score of Question No. 4 is 3.90. So it can be concluded that parents agree that the curriculum being taught is relevant to the modern times and employability.

Question No: (5) There is enhancement in soft skills, knowledge, moral code, integrity in your ward while studying in college.

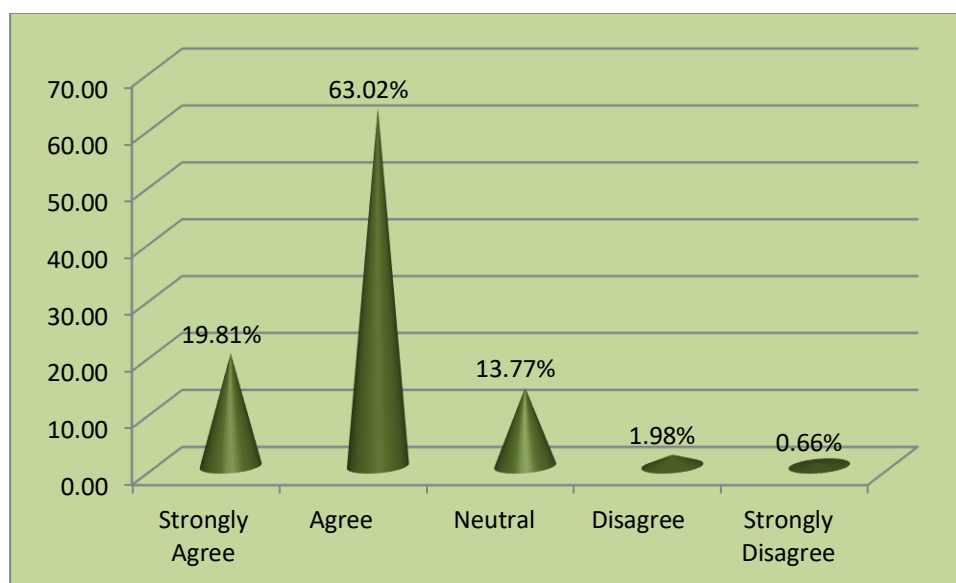


Figure 5 - Percentage of responses on enhancement in soft skills, knowledge, moral code, integrity while studying in college.

From the above table 5 it is clear that 210 i.e. 19.81 % of the parents strongly agree that there is enhancement in soft skills, knowledge, moral code, integrity in their ward while studying in college, 668 i.e. 63.02 % of the parents agree for the same, 146 i.e. 13.77 % of the parents views are neutral, 21 i.e. 1.98 % of the parents disagree and 0.66% of the parents strongly disagree that there is enhancement in soft skills, knowledge, moral code, integrity in their ward while studying in college. The results to Question 5 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 5.

Question No. 5 have Weighted Mean Score of 4.00, which lies in Likert range of ‘Agree’ so it can be concluded that parents agree that there is enhancement in soft skills, knowledge, moral code, integrity in their ward while studying in college.

Question No: (6) Discipline and work culture of the college is appreciable.

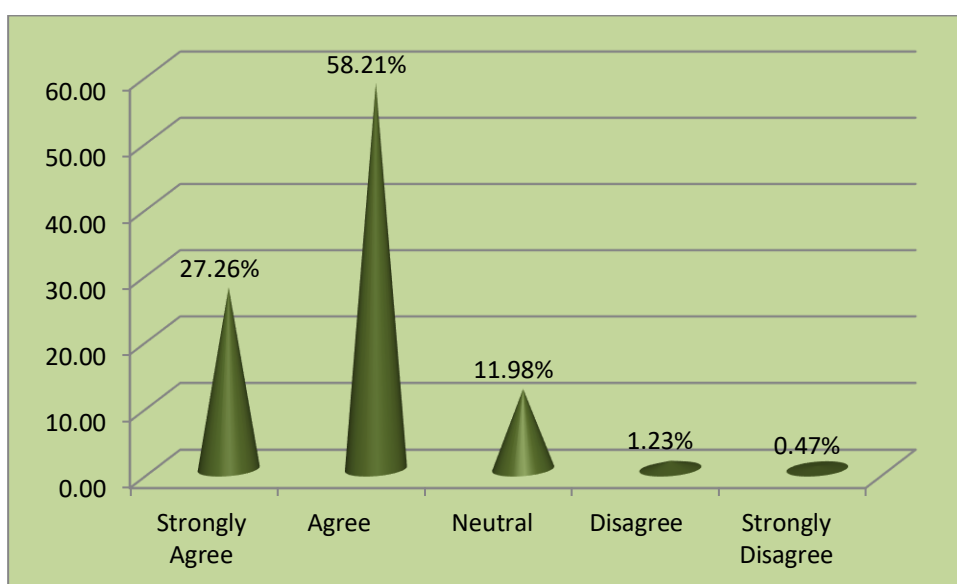


Figure 6 - Percentage of responses on discipline and work culture of the college.

From table 6 it is clear that 289 i.e. 27.26 % of the parents strongly agree that discipline and work culture of the college is appreciable, 617 i.e. 58.21 % of the parents agree for the same, 127 i.e. 11.98 % of the parents' views are neutral and 1.23% of the parents disagree and 0.47 % of the parents strongly disagree that discipline and work culture of the college is appreciable. The results to Question 6 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 6.

Weighted Mean Score of Question No. 6 is 4.12 which fall in the Likert range of 'Agree' which implies that the parents agree to the fact that discipline and work culture of the college is appreciable.

Question No: (7) Placement drives and job fairs are arranged in the college.

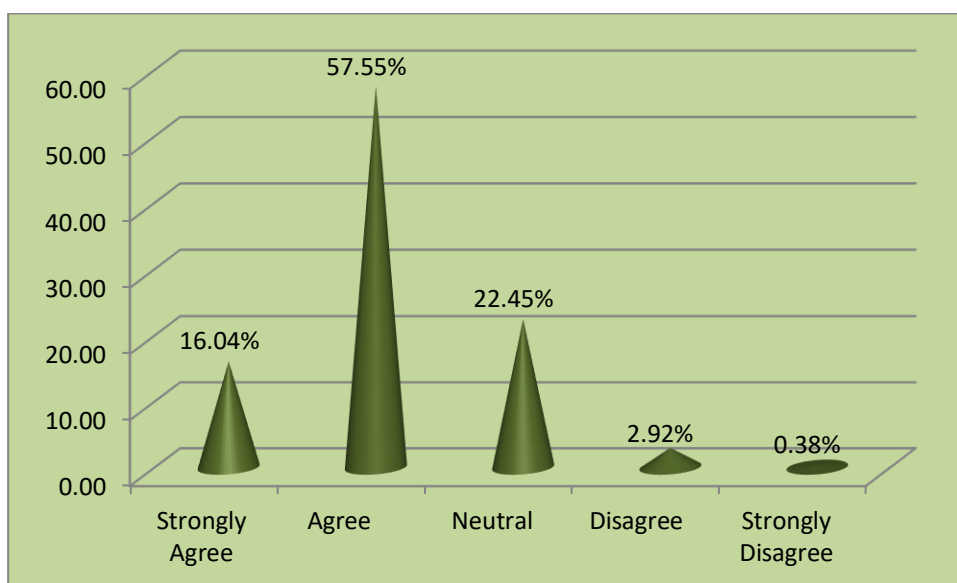


Figure 7 - Percentage of responses on placement drives and job fairs arranged in the college.

From table 7 it is clear that 170 i.e. 16.04 % of the parents strongly agree that placement drives and job fairs are arranged in the college, 610 i.e. 57.55 % of the parents agree for the same, 238 i.e. 22.45 % of the parents' views are neutral, 31 parents i.e. 2.92 % of the parents disagree and 4 parents i.e. 0.38 % of the parents strongly disagree that placement drives and job fairs are arranged in the college. The results to Question 7 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 7.

Weighted Mean Score of Question No. 6 is 3.87 which fall in the Likert range of 'Agree' which implies that placement drives and job fairs are arranged in the college.

Question No: (8) The college provides counselling and guidance to the students.

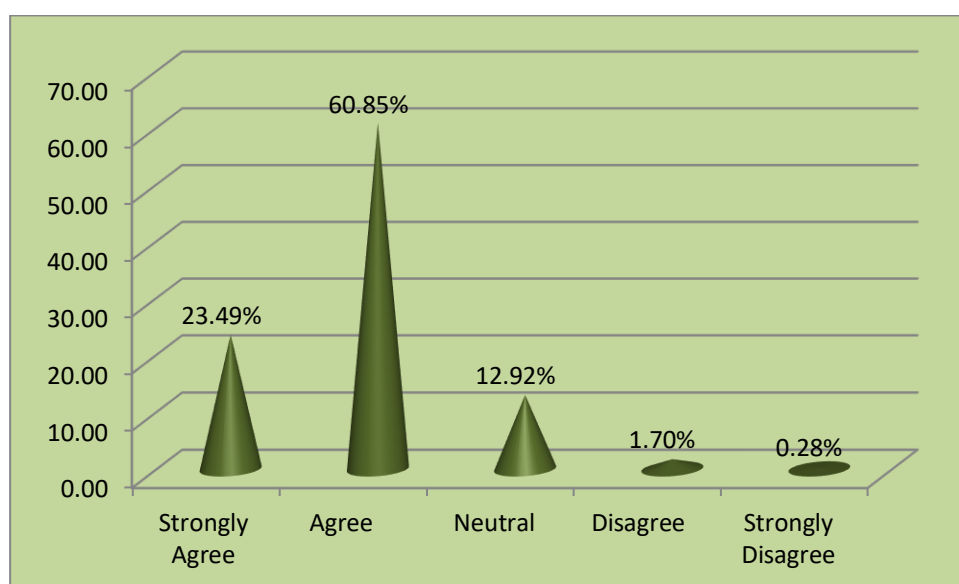


Figure 8 - Percentages of responses on provision of counselling and guidance to the students.

Table 8 shows that 249 i.e. 23.49 % of the parents strongly agree that the college provides counselling and guidance to the students, 645 i.e. 60.85 % of the parents agree for the same, 137 i.e. 12.92 % of the parents views are neutral, 18 parents i.e. 1.70 % of the disagree and 0.28% of the parents strongly disagree that the college provides counselling and guidance to the students. The results to Question 8 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 8.

Question No. 8 have Weighted Mean Score of 4.06, which lies in Likert range of ‘Agree’ so it can be concluded that parents agree that the college provides counselling and guidance to the students.

Question No: (9) The college makes considerable efforts for the holistic growth of the students.

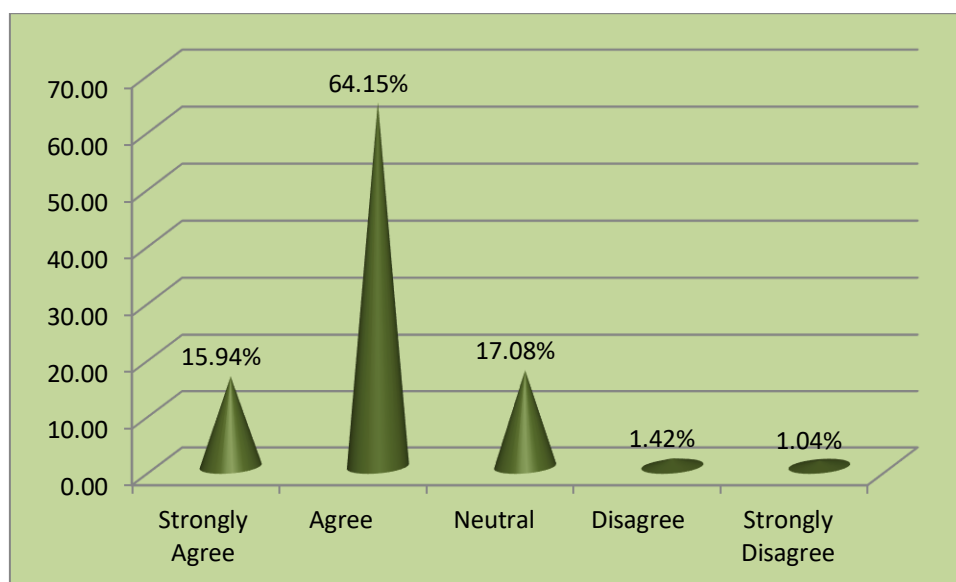


Figure 9 - Percentage of responses on holistic growth of the students.

Table 9 reveals that 169 i.e. 15.94 % of the parents strongly agree that the college makes considerable efforts for the holistic growth of the students, 680 i.e. 64.15 % of the parents agree for the same, 181 i.e. 17.08 % of the parents' views are neutral, 15 i.e. 1.42 % of the parents disagree and 1.04% of the parents strongly disagree that the college makes considerable efforts for the holistic growth of the students. The results to Question 9 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 9.

Question No. 9 have Weighted Mean Score of 3.93, which lies in Likert range of 'Agree' so it can be concluded that parents agree the college makes considerable efforts for the holistic growth of the students.

Question No: (10) The overall ambience of the college is excellent.

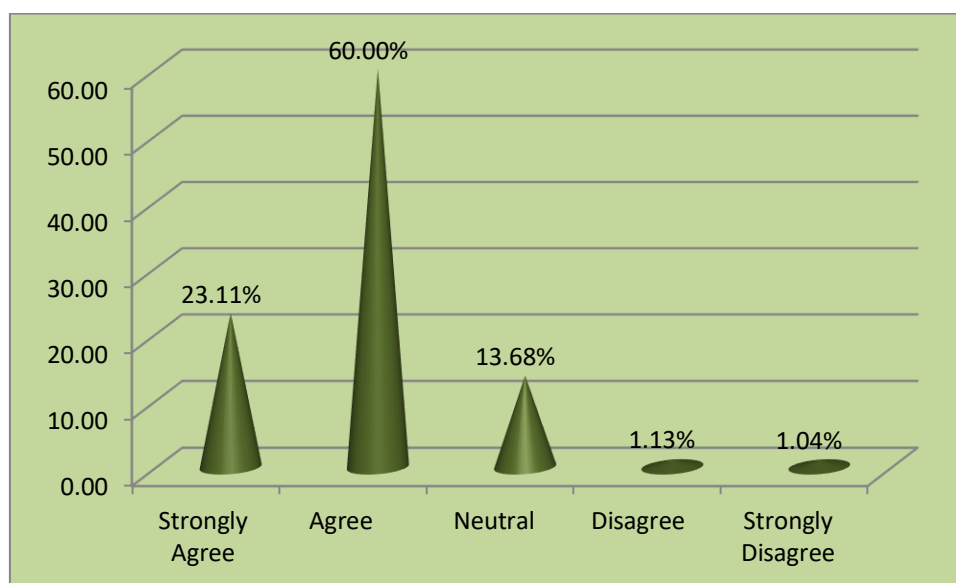


Figure 10 - Percentage of responses on overall ambience of the college.

Table 10 shows that out of 1060 parents surveyed it was found that 245 parents i.e. 23.11% of the parents strongly agree that the overall ambience of the college is excellent, 636 i.e. 60 % of the parents agree for the same, 145 i.e. 13.68 % of the parents views are neutral, 12 parents i.e. 1.13 % of the parents disagree and 1.04% of the parents strongly disagree that the overall ambience of the college is excellent. The results to Question 10 are presented below in Clustered Cone chart as shown in Figure 10.

Question No.10 has Weighted Mean Score of 4.04, so it can be concluded that parents agree that the overall ambience of the college is excellent.

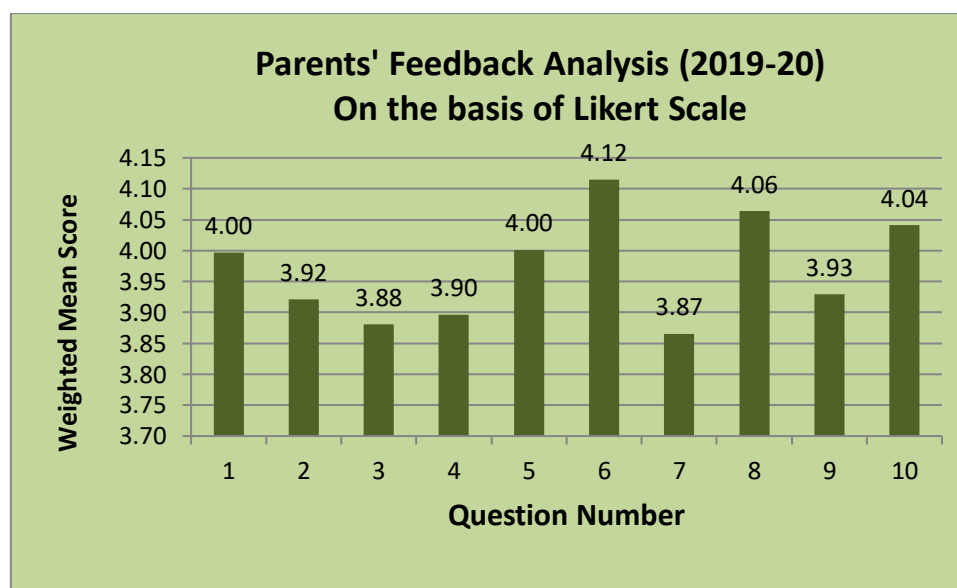


Figure 11 - Weighted Mean Score of questions.

Table 11 shows that the average of Weighted Mean Score of all questions related to curriculum is 3.972 which lies between Likert range of 3.4 to 4.2 that is the range for 'Agree', from which it can be concluded that parents agree that the curriculum, content, syllabus designed by the university, discipline and work culture of college and curriculum future prospects is adequate, update and relevant to present employment scenario and enhances their ward with better knowledge and skills.
